






How does economic development affect emigration?





The mobility transition curve in 2010




Note: The sample includes 143 origin countries and 81 destination countries



Economic growth has brought relatively more emigration than immigration


Cumulative distribution functions for emigration and immigration





High-income countries are increasingly attracting migrants from developing countries


Migrants from developing countries as a share of total migrants




Not all countries follow the same migration trajectory
