


MTM i-Map Layer on Migration and Development: Infographic ‘Migrant Entrepreneurship’

The infographic on Migrant Entrepreneurship is an output of the Migration and Development (M&D) layer of the intergovernmental information exchange project Interactive Map on Migration in Africa, the Middle East, and the Mediterranean Region (MTM i-Map 2011-2014), implemented in the framework of the Dialogue on Mediterranean Transit Migration (MTM), gathering officials from Algeria, Egypt, Ethiopia, 27 EU Member States, Ghana, Kenya, Lebanon, Libya, Mali, Morocco, Niger, Nigeria, Norway, Senegal, Switzerland, Syria, Tunisia, and Turkey.

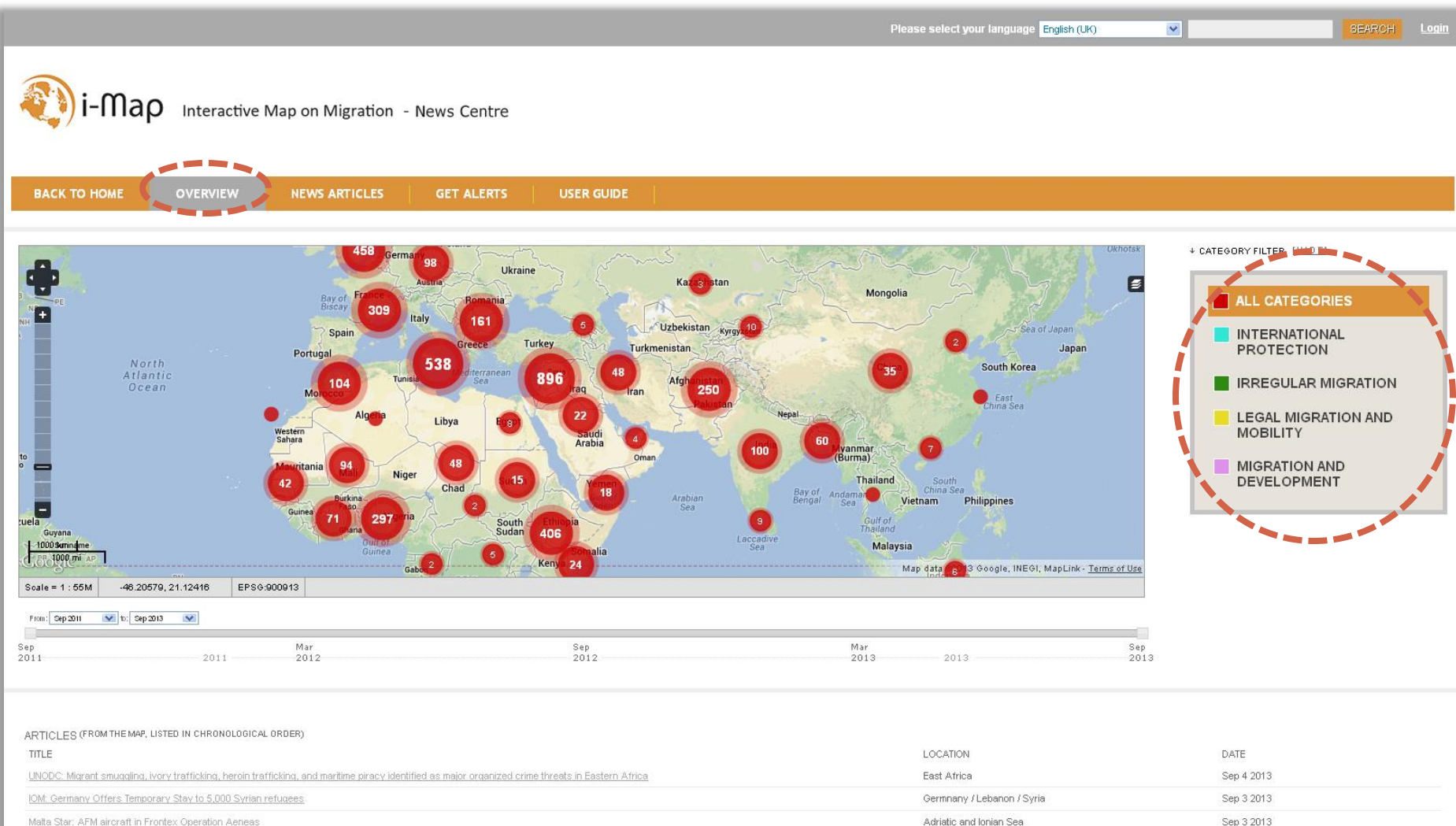
It is widely acknowledged that migrants have the potential to contribute to development, both in their countries of origin and in their countries of destination. Entrepreneurship is one possibility for migrants to do so. The decision to start an enterprise depends on factors related to the migrant’s cultural and personal predisposition as well as to the regulatory and business environment of the country. These factors influence the type of enterprise set up and its location, either in the country of origin or destination, and some have a specific impact on migrants. Public actors of countries of origin or destination can offer targeted incentives that create a more favourable regulatory and business environment for migrant entrepreneurs.

This infographic provides a visual overview on factors impacting on migrant entrepreneurship and policy options in this field.

Inde : le grand diasporama

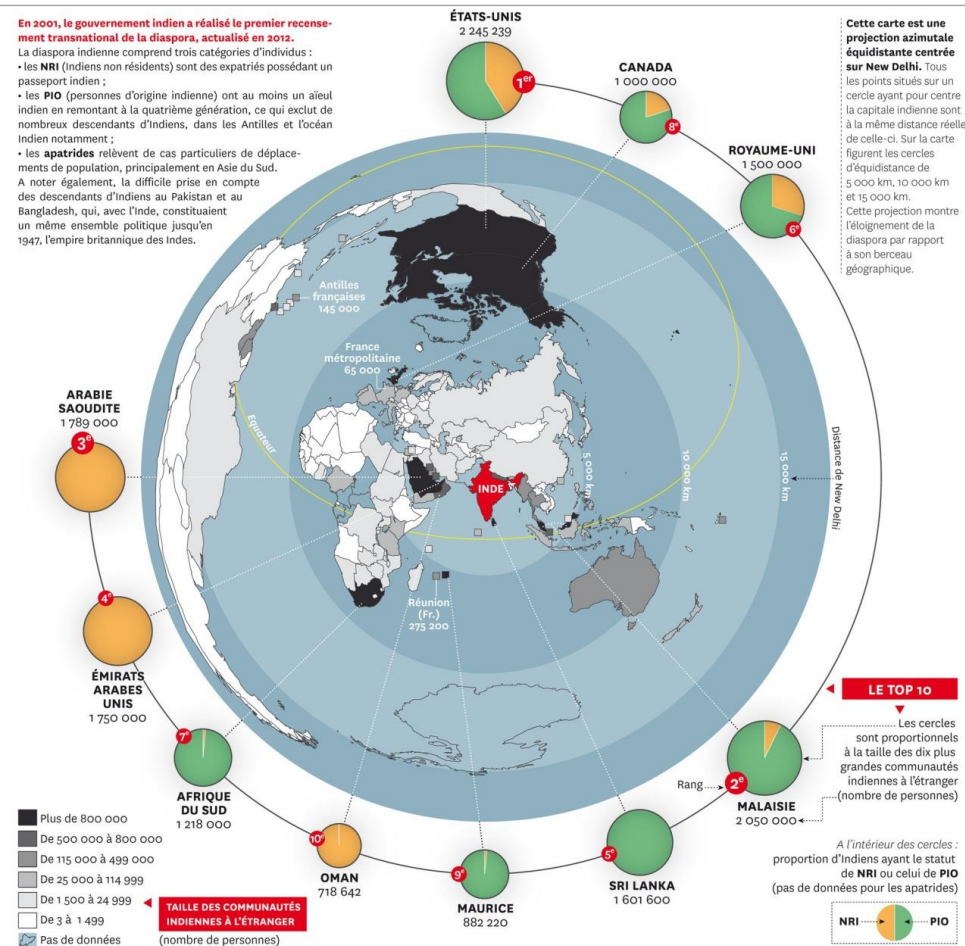
22 millions de personnes d'origine indienne vivent dans 190 pays.

En 2001, le gouvernement indien a réalisé le premier recensement transnational de la diaspora, actualisé en 2015.

La diaspora indienne comprend trois catégories d'individus :

- les **NRI** (Indiens non résidents) sont des expatriés possédant un passeport indien ;
- les **PIO** (personnes d'origine indienne) ont au moins un aïeul indien en remontant à la quatrième génération, ce qui exclut de nombreux descendants d'Indiens, dans les Antilles et l'océan Indien notamment ;
- les **apatrides** relèvent de cas particuliers de déplacements de population, principalement en Asie du Sud.

A noter également, la difficile prise en compte des descendants d'Indiens au Pakistan et au Bangladesh, qui, avec l'Inde, constituaient un même ensemble politique jusqu'en 1947, l'empire britannique des Indes.



La source COURRIER INTERNATIONAL. En octobre 2012, un nouveau rendez-vous, "Signaux", est apparu dans nos pages. COMMON EUROPEAN ASYLUM SYSTEM (CEAS)

ASYLUM is granted to people fleeing persecution or serious harm.

The process for applying asylum is now similar throughout the EU. (Asylum Procedures Directive)

Each applicant's fingerprints are taken and sent to a database called EURODAC. (EURODAC Regulation) These data are used to help identify the country responsible for the asylum application. (Dublin Regulation)

Asylum applicants receive **material reception conditions**, such as housing and food. (Reception Conditions Directive)

An asylum applicant is **interviewed by a case worker** trained in EU law, with the help of an interpreter, to determine whether he/she may qualify for refugee status or subsidiary protection. (Qualification Directive and Asylum Procedures Directive)

Asylum is **not granted** to the applicant at "first instance", but this refusal may be appealed in court.

Confirmation of the negative "first instance" decision by the court, following which the applicant may be returned to his/her country of origin or transit.

Refugee or subsidiary protection status is granted, which gives the person certain rights, such as access to a residence permit, the labour market and healthcare. (Qualification Directive)

Overturning of the negative "first instance" decision by the court.
